Bedroom Storage 101.

We'll walk you through the basics of bedroom storage — from closet types to standard clothing measurements for men and women.

freedomRail® REACH-IN CLOSET

- 1 A closet that has one storage wall and is usually at least a minimum of 24" deep.
- 2 Generally wall-to-wall unless there is an obstacle, such as a structural element or utility panel.



freedomRail WALK-IN CLOSET

- 1 A closet that has enough depth to walk inside it. Commonly an "L" or "U" configuration of shelving.
- 2 Walk-ins come in a variety of shapes and sizes but are usually a minimum of 4' x 4' and have a clear passage aisle.

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GLOSSARY OF TERMS

This Glossary includes terms that are useful when reviewing this guide:


Single/Long Hang: One single Clothes Rod — used to hang long garments.

Double Hang: One upper Clothes Rod above one lower Clothes Rod — used to hang shorter garments.

Triple Hang: One upper Clothes Rod, one middle Clothes Rod and one lower Clothes Rod stacked vertically approx 20" apart — used to hang small garments (typically kid's clothes)

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

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Reveal: A series of pull-out freedomRail accessories that add different kinds of functionality to a closet — storing shoes, hanging slacks or pants, hamper, etc.

OBox: A collection of melamine wood accessories for freedomRail that provide additional storage and organization possibilities.

The best-designed storage space considers your available space and your inventory of the items being stored.

Tip: Organize your closet into three groups; long hang, short hang, and items to be placed on shelves or in drawers. This inventory will help you to determine how much space should be allocated to each type of storage. Use this storage guide to help you with a smart closet design for your space.
